SUPPORTING CARERS TO CREATE SAFETY FOR CHILDREN



- Fostered children need a predictable, consistent environment in order to feel safe
- > Foster carers need to exercise control over their own feelings
- Provide emotional support by engaging the child
- Most valuable tool carers have to intervene is themselves
